

Upcoming Symposium

Hastings Law Journal, *Hastings Constitutional Law Quarterly*, and *Hastings Science and Technology Law Journal* are excited to be hosting a joint spring symposium on “The Evolution of Privacy in the Age of Technology” on Thursday, March 16th from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at UC Hastings in the Louis B. Mayer Lounge. MCLE credit will be available.

The symposium will feature two panel discussions amongst notable scholars, government actors, and high profile practitioners: The first panel will focus on the regulation of emerging technologies within the context of privacy, and the second on protection of consumers’ personal information. The keynote speaker will be notable legal scholar Jay Stanley, a Senior Policy Analyst with the ACLU Speech, Privacy, and Technology Project, who researches, writes, and speaks about technology-related privacy and civil liberties issues and their future.

Dear *Hastings Law Journal* alumni,


Serving as the Editor-in-Chief of Volume 68 of *Hastings Law Journal* has proven to be one of the most challenging years I have experienced to date, but also undeniably one of the most rewarding. It has been both a privilege and an honor to say the least. I have learned so much more than I could ever have envisioned when this year began, from the nature of the position itself, but more importantly from all of the outstanding, intelligent individuals I have had the opportunity to interact with because of it, from our student members, to authors, to alumni and faculty advisors.

While it is hard to believe that another volume of the *Journal* is soon coming to a close, I walk away from this year incredibly proud of what we have achieved. By the time August of this year rolls around, we will have published thirty-three articles and fourteen student notes, as well as Bluebooked more than 8500 footnotes! At those events *HLJ* proudly presented several outstanding speakers whose past experience includes serving in various cybersecurity-related positions in the Obama Administration, including: Michael Daniel, former White House Cybersecurity Coordinator, Eric Greenwald, former Special Assistant to the President and Senior Director for Cybersecurity, and Nathaniel Gleicher, former Director for Cybersecurity Policy on the National Security Council.

I want to sincerely thank all of the alumni who donated this year, served as members of the Alumni Board, or contributed their talents and expertise to the *Journal* in any other way. Your generosity and guidance assisted us greatly in being able to accomplish the many things we have this year that continue to improve *HLJ*. Also a huge thank you to all of the 2L and 3L staff members for all of the hard work they have put into Volume 68.
